

1. Identify the topic you currently need to understand from God's Word.
2. Do the study with Him till you know what His Word says and promises about it.
3. Write out a prayer to speak, so you have the truth all in one place to review.
4. Start presenting yourself with it—all of it, parts of it, sitting still or on the fly etc
5. Use those verses to identify and cast down every thought in your head that tries to exalt itself against that truth (growl if necessary, b/c the root word for meditate can be translated growl)!
6. Trust Him to teach you more, take the truths deeper, renew your mind and increase your revelation and faith.
7. Rest in Him (by grace through faith), and watch the transformation take place!

Steadfast Study from Biblical Dictionaries

STRONG: ar-ter-eh'-o From a derivative of G2904 (transposed); to be strong, that is, (figuratively) steadfast (patient): - endure.

THAYER: apoblepō

1) **to turn the eyes away from other things and fix them on some one thing**

1a) to look at attentively

2) to look with steadfast mental gaze

Stedfast in Scripture

KJV: OT/NT

(Job 11:15)

For then shalt thou lift up thy face without spot; yea, thou shalt be stedfast, and shalt not fear:

(Psa 78:8)

And might not be as their fathers, a stubborn and rebellious generation; a generation that set not their heart aright, and whose spirit was not stedfast with God.

(Psa 78:37)

For their heart was not right with him, neither were they stedfast in his covenant.

Psa 78 The next generation must be taught so they set their hope in God and do not forget His works (keep His commands: sozo so they are not like the past generation with no steadfast heart whose spirit had no faith in God.

Psa 78 The time in the desert after being set free from Egypt. God provided all (water, manna, birds/meat) and the people grumbled/lied with their lips, forgetting all God did in Egypt to set them free (plagues/separated the sea).

(Dan 6:26)

I make a decree, That in every dominion of my kingdom men tremble and fear before the God of Daniel: for he is the living God, and stedfast for ever, and his kingdom that which shall not be destroyed, and his dominion shall be even unto the end.

(1Co 15:58)

Therefore, my beloved brethren, be ye stedfast, unmoveable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, for as much as ye know that your labour is not in vain in the Lord.

1Co 15:50 Now this I say, brethren, that flesh and blood cannot inherit the kingdom of God; neither doth corruption inherit incorruption. 1 Behold, I shew you a mystery; We shall not all sleep, but we shall all be changed, 2 In a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trump: for the trumpet shall sound, and the dead shall be raised incorruptible, and we shall be changed. 3 For this corruptible must put on incorruption, and this mortal must put on immortality. 4 So when this corruptible shall have put on incorruption, and this

mortal shall have put on immortality, then shall be brought to pass the saying that is written, Death is swallowed up in victory. 5 O death, where is thy sting? O grave, where is thy victory? 6 The sting of death is sin; and the strength of sin is the law. 7 But thanks be to God, which giveth us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.

Old natures cannot inherit the Kingdom. Corruptible becomes incorruptible through Salvation. The last enemy is death of mortal bodies. (Psa 110) Death will be no more once imperishable bodies replace the perishable. COMPLETE transformation will happen. We must remain steadfast until then!

(Heb 3:14)

For we are made partakers of Christ, if we hold the beginning of our confidence stedfast unto the end;

(Heb 6:19)

Which hope we have as an anchor of the soul, both sure and stedfast, and which entereth into that within the veil;

(1Pe 5:9)

Whom resist stedfast in the faith, knowing that the same afflictions are accomplished in your brethren that are in the world.

AMPC: NT

(Joh 1:9)

There it was--the true Light [was then] coming into the world [the genuine, perfect, steadfast Light] that illumines every person. [Isa_49:6]

(Joh 7:28)

Whereupon Jesus called out as He taught in the temple [N1porches], Do you know Me, and do you know where I am from? I have not come on My own authority and of My own accord and as self-appointed, but the One Who sent Me is true (real, genuine, steadfast); and Him you do not know!

(Rom 12:12)

Rejoice and exult in hope; be steadfast and patient in suffering and tribulation; be constant in prayer.

(Rom 15:4)

For whatever was thus written in former days was written for our instruction, that by [our steadfast and patient] endurance and the encouragement [drawn] from the Scriptures we might hold fast to and cherish hope.

(1Co 1:8)

And He will establish you to the end [keep you steadfast, give you strength, and guarantee your vindication; He will be your warrant against all accusation or indictment so that you will be] guiltless and irreproachable in the day of our Lord Jesus Christ (the Messiah).

(1Co 10:12)

Therefore let anyone who thinks he stands [who feels sure that he has a steadfast mind and is standing firm], take heed lest he fall [into sin].

(1Co 15:58)

Therefore, my beloved brethren, be firm (steadfast), immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord [always being superior, excelling, doing more than enough in the service of the Lord], knowing and being continually aware that your labor in the Lord is not futile [it is never wasted or to no purpose].

(2Co 1:21)

But it is God Who confirms and makes us steadfast and establishes us [in joint fellowship] with you in Christ, and has consecrated and anointed us [N1ending us with the gifts of the Holy Spirit];

(Col 1:23)

[And this He will do] provided that you continue to N1stay with and in the faith [in Christ], well-grounded and settled and steadfast, not shifting or moving away from the hope [which rests on and is inspired by] the glad tidings (the Gospel), which you heard and which has been preached N2[as being designed for and offered without restrictions] to every person under heaven, and of which [Gospel] I, Paul, became a minister.

(Col 4:2)

Be earnest and unwearied and steadfast in your prayer [life], being [both] alert and intent in [your praying] with thanksgiving.

(2Th 2:17)

Comfort and encourage your hearts and strengthen them [make them steadfast and keep them unswerving] in every good work and word.

(Heb 6:19)

[Now] we have this [hope] as a sure and steadfast anchor of the soul [it cannot slip and it cannot N1break down under whoever steps out upon it--a hope] that reaches N2farther and enters into [the very certainty of the Presence] within the veil, [Lev_16:2]

(Heb 10:36)

For you have need of steadfast patience and endurance, so that you may perform and fully accomplish the will of God, and thus receive and N1carry away [and enjoy to the full] what is promised.

(Jas 5:11)

You know how we call those blessed (happy) who were steadfast [who endured]. You have heard of the endurance of Job, and you have seen the Lord's [purpose and how He richly blessed him in the] end, inasmuch as the Lord is full of pity and compassion and tenderness and mercy. [Job_1:21-22; Job_42:10; Psa_111:4]

(1Pe 5:12)

By Silvanus, a true (loyal, consistent, incorruptible) brother, as I consider him, I have written briefly to you, to counsel and urge and stimulate [you] and to declare [to you] that this is the true [account of the] grace (the undeserved favor) of God. Be steadfast and persevere in it.

(2Pe 1:10)

Because of this, brethren, be all the more solicitous and eager to make sure (to ratify, to strengthen, to make steadfast) your calling and election; for if you do this, you will never stumble or fall.

ESV: NT

(Act 11:23)

When he came and saw the grace of God, he was glad, and he exhorted them all to remain faithful to the Lord with steadfast purpose,

(1Co 15:58)

Therefore, my beloved brothers, be steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that in the Lord your labor is not in vain.

(Col 1:23)

if indeed you continue in the faith, stable and steadfast, not shifting from the hope of the gospel that you heard, which has been proclaimed in all creation under heaven, and of which I, Paul, became a minister.

(Heb 6:19)

We have this as a sure and steadfast anchor of the soul, a hope that enters into the inner place behind the curtain,

(Jas 1:12)

Blessed is the man who remains steadfast under trial, for when he has stood the test he will receive the crown of life, which God has promised to those who love him.

(Jas 5:11)

Behold, we consider those blessed who remained steadfast. You have heard of the steadfastness of Job, and you have seen the purpose of the Lord, how the Lord is compassionate and merciful.

(1Co 15:58)

so that, my brethren beloved, become ye stedfast, unmovable, abounding in the work of the Lord at all times, knowing that your labour is not vain in the Lord.

(2Co 1:7)

and our hope is stedfast for you, knowing that even as ye are partakers of the sufferings—so also of the comfort.

(1Th 5:24)

stedfast is He who is calling you, who also will do it .

(2Th 3:3)

and stedfast is the Lord, who shall establish you, and shall guard you from the evil;

(1Ti 1:12)

And I give thanks to him who enabled me—Christ Jesus our Lord—that he did reckon me stedfast, having put me to the ministration,

(1Ti 1:15)

stedfast is the word, and of all acceptance worthy, that Christ Jesus came to the world to save sinners—first of whom I am;

Stedfast is the word: If any one the oversight doth long for, a right work he desireth;

Stedfast is the word: For if we died together—we also shall live together;

(2Ti 2:13)

if we are not stedfast, he remaineth stedfast; to deny himself he is not able.

(Tit 1:9)

holding—according to the teaching—to the stedfast word, that he may be able also to exhort in the sound teaching, and the gainsayers to convict;

(Tit 3:8)

Stedfast is the word; and concerning these things I counsel thee to affirm fully, that they may be thoughtful, to be leading in good works—who have believed God; these are the good and profitable things to men,

(Heb 2:2)

for if the word being spoken through messengers did become stedfast, and every transgression and disobedience did receive a just recompense,

(Heb 2:17)

wherefore it did behove him in all things to be made like to the brethren, that he might become a kind and stedfast chief-priest in the things with God, to make propitiation for the sins of the people,

(Heb 3:2)

being stedfast to Him who did appoint him, as also Moses in all his house,

(Heb 3:5)

and Moses indeed was stedfast in all his house, as an attendant, for a testimony of those things that were to be spoken,

(Heb 6:19)

which we have, as an anchor of the soul, both sure and stedfast, and entering into that within the vail,

(Heb 9:17)

for a covenant over dead victims is stedfast, since it is no force at all when the covenant-victim liveth,

(1Pe 4:19)

so that also those suffering according to the will of god, as to a stedfast Creator, let them commit their own souls in good doing.

(1Pe 5:9)

whom resist, stedfast in the faith, having known the same sufferings to your brotherhood in the world to be accomplished.

(2Pe 1:10)

wherefore, the rather, brethren, be diligent to make stedfast your calling and choice, for these things doing, ye may never stumble,

(1Jn 1:9)

if we may confess our sins, stedfast He is and righteous that He may forgive us the sins, and may cleanse us from every unrighteousness;

(Rev 17:14)

these with the Lamb shall make war, and the Lamb shall overcome them, because Lord of lords he is, and King of kings, and those with him are called, and choice, and stedfast.'

(Rev 21:5)

And He who is sitting upon the throne said, 'Lo, new I make all things; and He saith to me, 'Write, because these words are true and stedfast;'

(Rev 22:6)

And he said to me, 'These words are stedfast and true, and the Lord God of the holy prophets did send His messenger to shew to His servants the things that it behoveth to come quickly:
